

- 4) Zoning Code had a 48-hour rule, which requires trailer be moved, but does not specify where or any limitations. Currently violators just move their trailers to other streets.
- c. Commissioner Elliott presented a list of locations she's identified with trailers that have not been moved.
 - 1) Would like to know what is keeping City from enforcing those trailers to move or be removed. Especially those with materials on them.
 - 2) Worries that the problem will continue growing.
 - i. Code Enforcement responded that the issue that most owners will simply move the trailer around. No real code to stop such action.
 - ii. Director Santillan suggest a 48 hour per month rule.
 - iii. Police Department could help with some of the traffic violations such as absence or license plates. Public street violations are a Police issue. Code Enforcement focuses on private property violations.
 - iv. Officer Chavez explained that issues can be tricky between Code Enforcement and Police Department in terms of jurisdiction. Explained that in other cities, neighbors police themselves.
 - v. Director Santillan explained a possible solution is more signage to reinforce ban of vehicles.
- d. Director Santillan brought up Municipal Code 4-4.720 regarding proper signage to prohibit trailers longer than 20 feet.
 - 1) Previous work from City Staff focused on tagging trailers if they did not move for over 48 hours. But no changes came to fruition.
- e. Commissioner Larios expressed interested in having the Police Department involved with this conversation.
- f. Director Santillan asked the entire Commission what they would like to see happen.
 - 1) Commissioner Elliott wants to see Police Department get involved, and better enforcement with the rules as it is, allowing trailers to only be parked for 48-hours.
 - 2) Director Santillan explained that Staff would be meeting to discuss the topic further, and then meet with legal counsel to explore actionable options the City can take.
